## Enrolments September 2022/2023

The Annual Admissions Notice was published in October and is ratified by the Board of Management. This confirms dates from which applications will be accepted as well as the closing date for completed applications.

#### PART 1 - Admissions to the 2022/2023 school year

Application and Decision Dates for admission to 2022/2023 The following are the dates applicable for admission to Junior Infants

- The school will commence accepting applications for admission on 1st Oct 2021.
- The school shall cease accepting applications for admission on 15th Feb 2022.
- The date by which applicants will be notified of the decision on their application is 1st March 2022.
- The period within which applicants must confirm acceptance of an offer of admission is 1st March 2022- 22nd March 2022.

### **Internet Safety**

With many children receiving new gifts of technology for Christmas, this is a timely reminder to monitor the settings and content on all devices that children are using at home.Safer Internet Day took place on Tuesday 8th February 2022. We emphasise the importance of a safe online environment and encourage parents and carers to set age-appropriate parental controls on digital devices and use internet filters to block malicious websites. Please be aware, that social media sites including Facebook, TikTok, Instagram and Snapchat are not appropriate for primary school aged pupils. Most have an age restriction of 13 due to content which can be inappropriate for younger children. Remember online messages can be sent from most devices that have an internet connection and not just a mobile phone.

### **Punctuality**



School begins at 9am sharp. We encourage you to make sure your child is in school on or before 9am daily. Being punctual for school means making sure your child is at school and ready to learn before the bell rings. Good punctuality at school is essential for students to achieve their full educational potential. It is also vital for students to form good habits for later life.

Our school doors open at 8:45am and class starts at 9:00am sharp every morning and children are expected to be punctual and in their class with their classmates each morning when the bell rings. It is so important for children to understand the importance of being punctual. Even missing a few minutes each day can add up to many hours over the school year.

In Lisdowney NS, Scoil Bhríde punctuality and attendance are recorded on the school management system Aladdin.All students arriving late or leaving early must be recorded in and out on this system.

We also ask that you are on time picking up your child daily. Small children can become very upset and anxious if they are left waiting when every other child has been collected.

#### Attendance

One of the most important things your child can do to achieve academic success is also one of the most basic: going to school every day for the full day. In fact, research has shown that your child's attendance record may be the biggest factor influencing his/her academic success.

#### **Benefits of Daily Attendance**

**Achievement:** students who attend school regularly are more likely to do well in reading and maths assessments than students who don't attend school regularly.

**Opportunity:** being in school every day gives children a chance to learn more about a vast range of things including about secondary school and third level opportunities.

**School Community:** just by being present at school, your child becomes an important member of our school community, learning valuable social skills, and developing a broader world view.

**The Importance of Education:** Your commitment to school attendance will also send a message to your child that education is a priority for your family, going to school every day is a critical part of educational success.

By making your child's school attendance a priority, you will be taking an important step in supporting your child's school success, and setting a good example. You will also make your child aware of your understanding of the value of education. Remember every day counts.

# Nut Allergy

A number of our pupils have nut allergies of varying degrees of severity. Parents of children in the classes are requested to refrain from including nuts/nut byproducts/eggs as part of their child's school lunch.

Nut allergies are serious -

**Mild to moderate Allergic reaction** -swelling of lips, face and eyes, hives or welts, tingling mouth, abdominal pain, vomiting.

Severe Allergic reaction – Anaphylaxis— Difficulty/noisy breathing, Swelling of tongue, Swelling/tightness in throat, Difficulty talking and/or hoarse voice, Wheeze or persistent cough, Loss of consciousness and/or collapse, Pale and floppy.

In severe cases use of an Anapen will be necessary—so please abide by the instructions outlined.
